Players arriving after 9:30 am will not be paired in the first round. Rounds 2-5 will begin within 15 minutes of the completion of the last game of the prior round.

Awards ceremony immediately follows completion of the fifth game.

Awards usually are completed before 4:00 pm.

**Medical:** Please notify registration desk regarding potential medical issues with players.

**Format:** Five round Swiss. G/30. All students play all five games. Divisions are set by directors

after registration has been completed. Tournaments are rated by the Northwest Rating

Service.

**Byes may be requested.** Students are encouraged to get as much tournament play as their schedules permits. Rules of chess, sportsmanship, camaraderie, and team building are benefits learned while attending tournaments. The many benefits of chess received are directly proportional to the quality of study and the number of games played in serious competition.
